



Judging



Morning judging	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Each team will be scheduled for three morning interviews – one for each of the three judging areas and each with a pair of judges. • The judges will be asking questions consistent with the relevant rubric. • Only team members may interact with the judges. • Any others who interact will be asked to leave the room.
Robot Design 15-minute Interview	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plan to present your Robot Design Executive Summary in 4 minutes or less, including a trial run. • Bring your robot and any attachments. • Be prepared to answer questions about your team’s robot design and programming. • Discussion with judges will last ~11 minutes. • There may be observers who watch your interaction with the judges.
Project 15-minute Interview	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bring any equipment you need for your presentation • Each team has 5 minutes to set up AND present its research • Discussion with judges will last ~10 minutes • There may be observers who watch your presentation
Core Values 15-minute Interview	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be prepared to show off your team spirit during a special Core Values challenge lasting ~5 minutes. • Plan to present your Core Values Poster in 2 minutes or less. • Discussion with judges will last ~8 minutes. • No observers (except for coaches) will be allowed in the room.
Core Values Ambassadors	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A Core Values Ambassador may visit your team at any time during the day and at any of the event locations - e.g., in the Pits, on the Game Floor, during lunch, at the Practice Table, in the parking lot.
Call Backs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If the judges decide they need more information from a team, they may schedule an afternoon “call back” session. • Coaches will be notified of call-back appointments early afternoon.
Rubrics	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Completed rubrics will be available for pick-up at the end of the day.
