

## **Robot Game**



Practice	•	During the Practice Round, each team has the opportunity for a practice match in
Round		the morning on a <b>COMPETITION</b> table.
	•	The practice round provides both teams and officials the opportunity to become
		familiar with the competition game procedures.
Practice	•	There will be several shared robot game practice tables for use by teams.
tables	•	These are different from the competition tables and are <b>NOT</b> the ones used for the
		Practice Round.
	•	Usage of the practice tables will be will monitored by Practice Table Managers.
	•	Sign up with a Practice Table Manager for a time slot.
	•	These are a shared resource - please be considerate and respectful of other teams.
Official	•	Each team has the opportunity for three official competition matches in the
Rounds		afternoon.
	•	The <u>top</u> scores from the three official rounds will be used for the standings in robot
		performance.
	•	The next highest score is used to break ties.
Staging	•	A small table will be available beside each competition table. The competing team
table		may set attachments on the table while not in use. The referees will also use the
		table for setting aside game pieces as needed during the match.
On Deck	•	Each team waits in the queuing (or "on deck") area until called upon to approach
area		the table.
Ready line	•	During the match, only two (2) team members may be at the table at any time.
		Other team members may wait in the "ready" area until tagged for being at the
		table.
Matches	•	The start and end of each match are announced by the Emcee.
	•	Each match lasts 2.5 minutes.
Scoring	•	The referee marks the score sheet, based on the condition of the playing field at the
		conclusion of the match.
	•	The referee reviews the score sheet with a team member regarding missions
		completed and penalties.
	•	Only team members interact with the referees. Coaches are <b>NOT</b> a part of that
		interaction.
	•	If there are any questions as to mission completion or scoring conditions, this is the
		one and only time to discuss.
	•	The referee and a team member sign off on the score sheet.
	•	Once the score sheet is signed, that score is <b>final</b> and <b>may not</b> be changed.
Score	•	Score sheets are submitted for computer tabulation and scores are displayed for all
sheets		to see.
	•	Completed score sheets will be available for pick-up at the end of the day.
